The Cinematograph was born in Lyon Welcome to Rue du Premier-Film!



On 19 March 1895, in the Monplaisir district of Lyon, Louis and Auguste Lumière placed their Cinematograph facing the door of their photographic plate-making factory on chemin Saint-Victor, where they shot the first film in the history of cinema: *Leaving the Lumière Factories*. The chemin Saint-Victor then became the rue du Premier-Film ('First Film Street') in 1925, and the Institut Lumière, Lyon's film library, has welcomed cinema lovers from all over the world since 1982. The Wall of Filmmakers bears witness to the hundreds of luminaries of the seventh art who have passed through its doors.

Tim Burton: Lumière Award honouree 2022

Tim Burton is a visionary, a master of styles and an artist, who has given the world of cinema a universe of rare coherence with an unprecedented impact on popular culture. From his first movies, Burton establishes his universe, skilfully blending his intensely personal expressivity with novelistic lyricism and pictorial references, traversing the entire history of art between the gothic and baroque, comedy, horror, romanticism or works tinged with melancholy. Beetlejuice and Edward Scissorhands, as well as his sublime interpretation of the classic comic book Batman, put him on the map. His work also includes uproarious comedies, musicals, fantasy films or horror flicks: Mars Attacks!, Dark Shadows, Sleepy Hollow. From Big Fish to Ed Wood, from Alice in Wonderland to Dumbo, Burton is always in search of the best way to tell a story, following the likes of Edgar Allan Poe and Lewis Carroll... It is impossible to dissociate Burton from the constellation of actors who have made up his galaxy: Johnny Depp, Helena Bonham Carter, Michael Keaton, Winona Ryder, Jack Nicholson, Danny DeVito, Michael Pfeiffer, Glenn Close, Christina Ricci, Eva Green, Marion Cotillard... It is also thanks to the director's long collaboration with composer Danny Elfman, who created some of the most iconic scores in contemporary cinema for him, that Tim Burton has become, over a 35-year career, a bona fide rock star of the big screen. With a great sense of pride, we celebrate his incomparable œuvre.

Louis Malle, the solitary figure of French cinema

At the crossroads of the New Wave, a director of American independent works and a French auteur, Louis Malle, tackled all subjects, defying the restrictions and taboos that constricted 'proper' French society. In 1963, he adapted the sulphurous Drieu la Rochelle for *The Fire Within*. In 1974, with Patrick Modiano, a great specialist of the period, he painted an acerbic portrait of the France of the collaboration and the Vichy regime in *Lacombe, Lucien*. In the 1970s, *Pretty Baby* (based on the life of photographer Ernest J. Bellocq) and *Murmur of the Heart* provoked considerable controversy. With the collaboration of Jean-Claude Carrière, he produced *May Fools*, a surreal and hilarious depiction of the bourgeoise in the aftermath of May 1968. He also directed such popular successes as *Goodbye, Children/Au revoir les enfants*, winner of seven César awards in 1988. The festival will provide the opportunity to (re)discover, on the big screen, the artists who have accompanied his work: Jeanne Moreau (*Elevator to the Gallows/Frantic*, 1958, *The Lovers*, 1958...), Maurice Ronet, Brigitte Bardot, Jean-Paul Belmondo, Aurore Clément, Dominique Blanc... as well as Brooke Shields, Susan Sarandon, Burt Lancaster and Ed Harris.

The retrospective will feature Justine Malle and Alexandra Stewart.

To mark the occasion, previously unseen restorations by Gaumont are slated for theatrical release on 9 November by Malavida.

Sidney Lumet, the prince of New York

Still a child during the economic crisis that hit America in the late 1920s, Sidney Lumet acquainted himself with those left behind by the Great Depression and developed a keen political awareness at a young age. He grew up on Broadway and was directed on stage by Joseph Losey, among others, before heading to the front when the United States entered the war. In 1957, after an initial career in television, his first feature film, Twelve Angry Men, was a critical masterpiece, winning the Golden Bear in Berlin and receiving an Academy Award nomination for Best Picture and Best Director. The film remains arguably the most famous of the courtroom dramas, thanks to its masterful direction and Henry Fonda's brilliant performance. Lumet's cinema is made up of characters of integrity fighting against a corrupt system (Serpico, 1973), but also of outsiders (Dog Day Afternoon, 1975, Equus, 1977), arrivistes or reformed characters, painting a palette ranging from social drama to modern tragedy. To perfect his impactful cinema, he surrounded himself with the most gifted screenwriters of New Hollywood: Waldo Salt, Norman Wexler or Frank Pierson. His movies were rooted in the heart of New York, where the filmmaker grew up, the perfect backdrop for the crime thrillers and dramas that compose his filmography. Sidney Lumet directed some of the greatest actors, who played some of their finest roles: Al Pacino in Serpico and Dog Day Afternoon, Marlon Brando in The Fugitive Kind, Faye Dunaway in Network, or Sean Connery in The Anderson Tapes and The Offence.

This exceptional Lumet revival has been made possible thanks to Paramount, Sony, Warner and Park Circus, who have provided the festival with newly published material of the films.

Permanent History of Women Filmmakers: Mai Zetterling

The 'Permanent History of Women Filmmakers' series has enabled us, edition after edition, to discover or rediscover the works of, among others, the Ukrainian Soviet director Larissa Shepitko, the American Dorothy Arzner, the Italian Lina Wertmüller, and the Japanese Kinuyo Tanaka. This year's festival will focus on the work of Swedish director Mai Zetterling. In the early 1960s, after having made two films for Ingmar Bergman and spent part of her career in England, she made the choice to become a filmmaker. Initially, she produced ethnographic documentaries financed by the BBC, then went on to direct a short film that won a prize at the Venice Film Festival. She subsequently signed her first feature film, Loving Couples,

magnificently lit by Sven Nykvist and presented at the Cannes Film Festival in 1965. From the outset, Mai Zetterling established a straightforward and powerful voice, whose audacity shocked some viewers, and created an oeuvre devoted primarily to the study of the female condition. She went on to direct six feature films, including *Night Games* and *The Girls*, and made contributions to collective films. She directed Harriet Andersson, Ingrid Thulin, Bibi Andersson and others.

André De Toth's Hungarian films

He was not yet called 'André De Toth', but 'Tóth Endre', in the Hungarian style, and had not yet been nicknamed 'the last one-eyed man in Hollywood', celebrated by Bertrand Tavernier, but this young son of a film-loving bourgeois was born in 1913 in southern Hungary. After an ill-fated experience as theatre writer, he was taken under the benevolent wings of playwright Ferenc Molnar and poet Mihaly Babits. Thanks to them, he visited the Hunnia studios in Budapest and immediately made himself irreplaceable. He continued his apprenticeship by travelling from London, where he lent a hand to the Korda siblings (the Hungarians who dominated British cinema) to Hollywood, where he lacked the necessary film directing experience in order to be truly taken seriously. Nevertheless, upon his return to Budapest, he directed five films in a row. in 1939 alone, switching from one style to another, ranging from the crime thriller The Five-Forty to a female-centred chronicle, Two Girls on the Street, a historical biography Semmelweis, named after the doctor who invented asepsis, the melodrama of Wedding in Toprin, or the moral fable Six Weeks of Happiness. These works opened the doors to Hollywood, where he went into exile, like many of his compatriots, amidst the rise of Nazism. De Toth, who often visited the Institut Lumière at the invitation of Bertrand Tavernier and Thierry Frémaux, left us in 2002. It is exhilarating today to revisit his little-known and promising budding career. In collaboration with the Hungary National Film Institute - Film Archive, who restored all the films of the retrospective.

Two Icons

Jeanne Moreau, director

Magnificent in the films of Louis Malle (*Elevator to the Gallows/Frantic, The Lovers*), Jeanne Moreau lent her talent to the greatest filmmakers: François Truffaut, Luis Buñuel or Joseph Losey. From 1976, she directed three films, which have become very scarce. Discover these motion pictures in restored prints, thanks to the work of the Jeanne Moreau Fund and Carlotta Films.

Meiko Kaji, Lady Scorpion

An intense gaze on an impassive face, Meiko Kaji was the Japanese incarnation of revenge and insubordination. We pay tribute to a magnetic icon of three visual splendours, blending cruelty with lyricism: the first two episodes of the epic Female Prisoner Scorpion and the feature film Lady Snowblood. This triplet of works had a major influence on Quentin Tarantino for Kill Bill. A Blu-ray box set of the Female Prisoner Scorpion saga will be released in the near future by Le Chat qui fume.

James Gray

He is perhaps the most European of the American filmmakers, having grown up with the films of the New Wave. Discovered by the thriller *Little Odessa*, he has made eight films that are both intimate and dazzling, often with autobiographical overtones, in which the difficulty of family relationships plays a major role. After the jungle of *The Lost City of Z* and the space of *Ad Astra*, he returns to his childhood in Queens with the magnificent *Armageddon Time*, which he will present as a premiere.

Marlène Jobert

After debuting with Jean-Luc Godard (Masculin Féminin), she became one of the most popular stars of the 1970s, as comfortable in comedies by Michel Audiard or Philippe de Broca as with Claude Chabrol and Maurice Pialat (We Won't Grow Old Together). Her vivacious beauty (with her freckles!) and her tenacity juxtaposed with her apparent fragility have made Jobert an endearing heroine.

Lee Chang-dong

A committed writer, Lee Chang-dong stepped behind the camera in 1997 with *Green Fish* and revealed his singular cinematographic poetry. He confirmed his talents in 1999 with *Peppermint Candy*, then in 2002 with *Oasis*, which won a prize at the Venice Film Festival. *Poetry* and *Burning* represent significant moments of delicacy in competition at the Cannes Film Festival. To be discovered: three of his works in restored prints never seen before, presented by Diaphana, and the first-ever screening in France of his latest short film, *Heartbeat*.

Nicole Garcia

The gracefully slender and lively Nicole Garcia began performing in a series of theatrical and cinematic works following her Conservatory studies, collaborating with the biggest filmmakers: Tavernier, Sautet, Miller, Deville or Schoendoerffer. In the early 1990s, she stepped behind the camera to put her distinctive stamp of narrative lyricism on French cinema. After the success of Every Other Weekend, she filmed eight feature films, including The Adversary, based on Emmanuel Carrère's work, and From the Land of the Moon, an adaptation of Milena Agus's novel, both presented in competition at the Cannes Film Festival.





The remakes of Leaving the Lumière Factories





Join us on Saturday, October 22nd in the early afternoon, in front of the Hangar, to witness the filming, directed by Tim Burton! On 19 March 1895, Louis and Auguste Lumière shot the first film with the Cinematograph, *Leaving the Lumière Factories*, on chemin Saint-Victor, opposite the family factory.

Every year, during the festival, a remake of this first film in the history of cinema is shot on the very spot where the Lumière brothers first turned the crank, on what has become Rue du Premier-Film (First-Film Street). Since this tradition began, some of the biggest names in cinema have taken part in the exercise: Quentin Tarantino, Jerry Schatzberg, Michael Cimino, Paolo Sorrentino, Wong Kar-wai, Xavier Dolan, Park Chan-wook, Costa-Gavras, Martin Scorsese, Pedro Almodóvar, Francis Ford Coppola and even Jane Campion last year... It also provided the opportunity for two actresses, Catherine Deneuve and Jane Fonda (laureates of the Lumière Award in 2016 and 2018 respectively), to direct their first film, following in the footsteps of the Lumière brothers.

The Institut Lumière rescued three historic theatres in Lyon from closure. Today, the cinemas have been renovated and screen a wide variety of national releases all year long on a total of 10 screens in downtown Lyon. Lumière Terreaux: 40 rue du Pdt E. The Lumière Museum

Louis and Auguste Lumière invented the Cinematograph in Lyon in the Monplaisir district. The exhibitions of the Lumière Museum are housed in the family Villa, featuring various technological advances that led to the invention of the Cinematograph and includes a fascinating glimpse into how the Lumière films were operated and distributed.

A cinema library

Founded by historian Raymond Chirat, it is located on the 3rd floor of the Villa Lumière.

Premier-Film Bookstore and DVD shop

Open since 2018, facing the Hangar du Premier-Film, the bookstore is entirely dedicated to the theme of cinema and boasts over 3,000 books and magazines and more than 4,000 DVD titles.

The Cinema Galleries

The two galleries of the Institut Lumière are devoted to film photography and exhibitions of collectible movie posters. Cinema Gallery 1 is located on rue du Premier-Film, in the former warehouse of the Lumière Factory, next to the bookstore. Cinema Gallery 2, in downtown Lyon (Rue de l'Arbre Sec), has already hosted over twenty exhibitions.

Festivals and events

Sport, Literature and Cinema: In nine editions, this festival has gained importance, exploring the link between sport, literature, fiction films and documentaries. Every winter, the Institut Lumière invites authors, filmmakers and athletes and features a bookstore with sports-themed publications.

Also: Every week a special silent film event, the Jacques Deray Prize, new versions of *Leaving the Factories*, film-concerts at the Auditorium of Lyon, outdoor summer screenings in Cinemascope...

Publishing

The Institut Lumière manages a collection with publishing house Actes Sud and issues books on the cinema, biographies and interviews of filmmakers such as Sergio Leone, Alfred Hitchcock, John Ford, Claude Sautet... Some 40 titles are currently available.

The Institut Lumière and Actes Sud also publish the monthly cinema review, *Positif*.

The collections

The mission of the Institut Lumière is to preserve worldwide heritage cinema. It houses a large collection of 35mm and 16mm prints, as well as 'non-film' material (books, photographs, posters, scripts...), making it one of the main archival film libraries in France.

Educational programmes

The pedagogical department works with academic institutions all year round (50,000 students) and proposes film lessons, workshops and introductions to the cinema.
